## PERMANENT SIGNS

### ALL NEW SIGNS WITHIN THE CITY REQUIRE A PERMIT

Permits will be issued only to a licensed sign contractor to ensure conformity to current code.

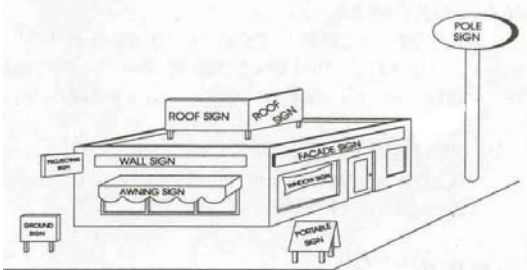
Signs moved from an old location to a new location require a permit.

Sign types in business, commercial and industrial zones may be flush wall, freestanding, projecting or roof mounted.

Maximum size of signs is based upon the linear footage of the building façade or the linear frontage of the property on a public street right-of-way.

Permits are required for alterations by paint or an overlay to an existing sign.

Permits are \$25.00. To view a sample permit or to see the entire sign code section of the Zoning and Development code visit [www.gjcity.org](http://www.gjcity.org).



## SPECIAL EVENTS

A special event sign permit is required for wind driven signs including banners, pennants, flags or balloons.

These signs are commonly used for Grand Openings, special sales and seasonal sales to name a few. There are no size regulations and the number of signs on one event permit is not limited.

Pennants, inflatables, flags or balloons may be displayed for up to 14 consecutive days in any calendar quarter. These signs must be installed so as not to pose a safety hazard for motorist and pedestrians. Wind driven signs may not be attached to any utility poles.

Banners may be displayed for a consecutive 30 day period during each calendar quarter and must be fastened securely to the building at all contact points.

All Banners obtained for advertising over Main Street also require a permit.

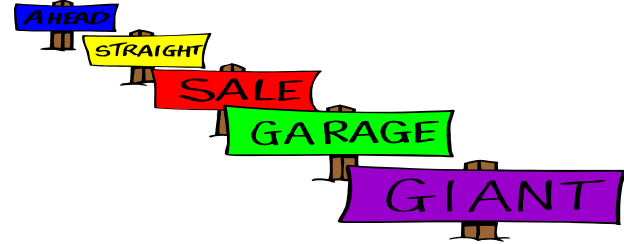
A licensed sign contractor is not required to obtain the special event permit.

Permits are \$25.00 per calendar quarter.



## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Campaign signs are allowed on private property sixty (60) days before the primary election and are to be removed ten (10) days after the election.



### Prohibited Signs Include:

- Portable signs such as sandwich boards or A-frames, except that one portable sign per business is allowed next to the building in shopping areas designed to invite pedestrian traffic.
- Signs that flash, blink, move, chase or have any animation effects.
- Signs that imitate an official traffic sign or signal.
- Off premise real estate signs.
- Any sign placed in City right-a-way, blocking sidewalks or creating a safety hazard will be confiscated. Signs are not allowed in medians, on utility poles or telephone poles.
