

What is the proper procedure to clear an active Municipal Court warrant if I no longer live in Grand Junction, Colorado?

You may bring or mail two separate letters to the Municipal Court and the City Attorney's Office at: 250 N. 5th Street, Grand Junction, CO 81501. In your letter you may advise the court of your current circumstances and how you would like to proceed with your case. **You MUST deliver a copy of the letter to the Grand Junction Municipal Court AND the Grand Junction City Attorney's Office.** They can be a copy of the same letter and **MUST** include a sentence at the bottom advising that a letter was sent to both offices or the Judge will not be able to review your letter. Please remember to include a current mailing address and phone number where you can be reached.

A second option may be to hire an attorney in the Grand Junction area to represent you on your case. The Municipal Court clerks are not allowed to recommend an attorney for you.

A third option may be to return to Grand Junction to contact a local bail bondsman and have them assist you in clearing the warrant and setting a return court date. The Municipal Court clerks are not allowed to recommend a bail bondsman for you.

A final option may be to return to Grand Junction to post a bond in person at the Municipal Court clerk's window and set a return court date.
